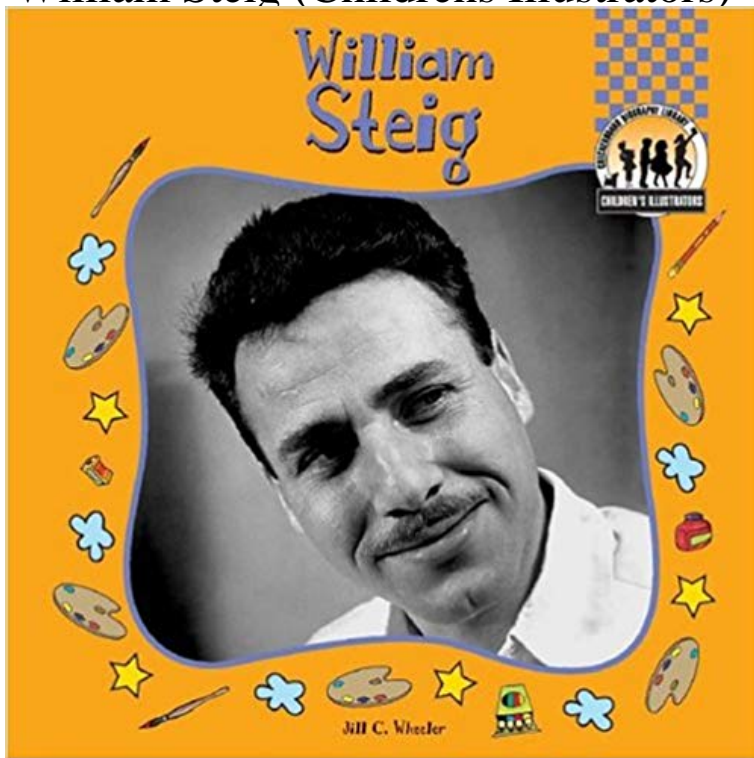


William Steig (Childrens Illustrators)
