


Chronic Fatigue and Other Ailments

Chronic fatigue syndrome (CFS) is a long-term illness with a wide range of symptoms. The symptoms of CFS/ME are similar to the symptoms of some other illnesses. Currently, there is no single test to diagnose ME/CFS. Doctors make a diagnosis by excluding all other illnesses after a person has had symptoms continually for a period of time. On occasion, fatigue is a symptom of other underlying conditions that require treatment, such as chronic infection or inflammation, chronic kidney disease, myalgic encephalomyelitis (ME), postviral fatigue syndrome, chronic fatigue immune deficiency syndrome, and chronic fatigue syndrome. Certain other diseases, many of which have similar symptoms to CFS, include fibromyalgia syndrome, myalgic encephalomyelitis, neurasthenia, multiple chemical sensitivities, and chronic mononucleosis. Although these illnesses may present with a primary symptom other than fatigue, chronic fatigue is commonly associated with all of them.
