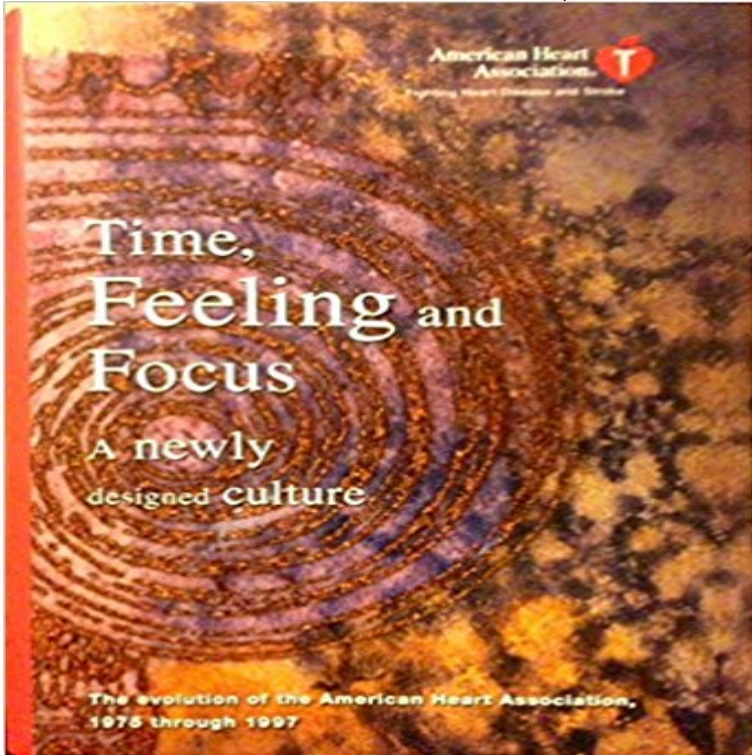


Time, feeling and focus: A newly designed culture : the evolution of the American Heart Association, 1975 thru 1997



A pioneering group of physicians and social workers formed the first Association for the Prevention and Relief of Heart Disease in New York City in 1915. They were concerned about the lack of heart disease information.
