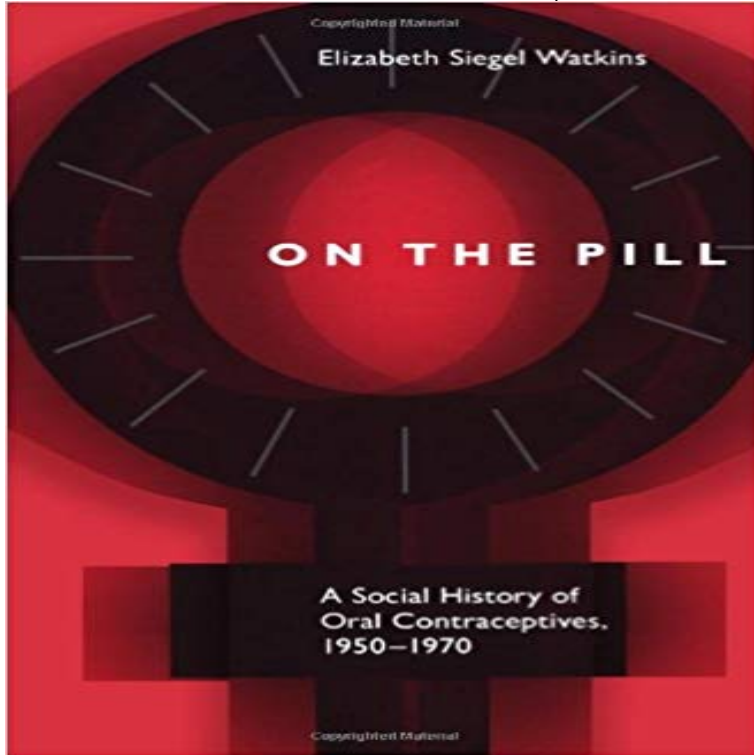


On the Pill: A Social History of Oral Contraceptives, 1950-1970

Her study helps us not only to understand the contraceptive revolution as such but also to appreciate the misinterpretations that surround it.
