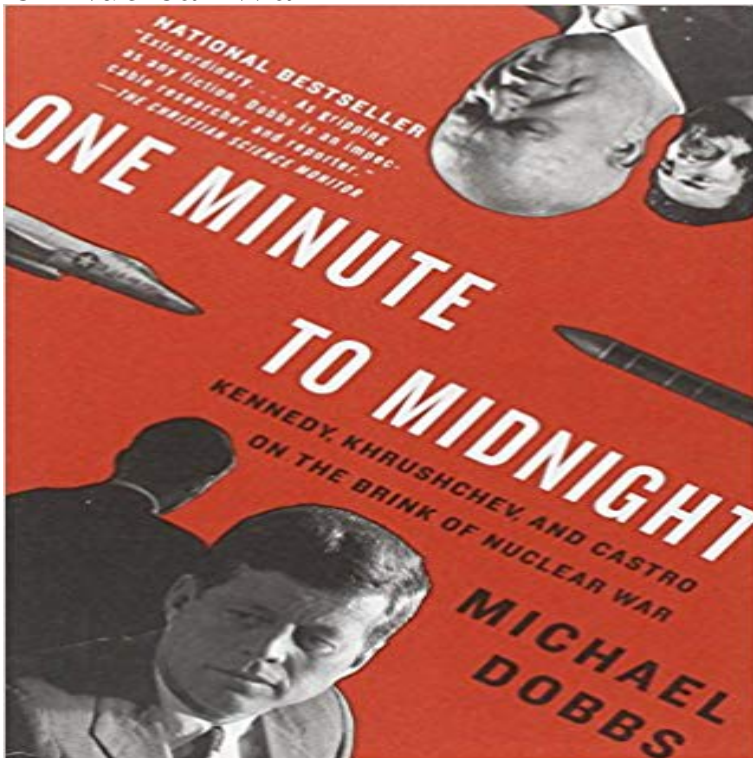


One Minute to Midnight: Kennedy, Khrushchev, and Castro on the Brink of Nuclear War
