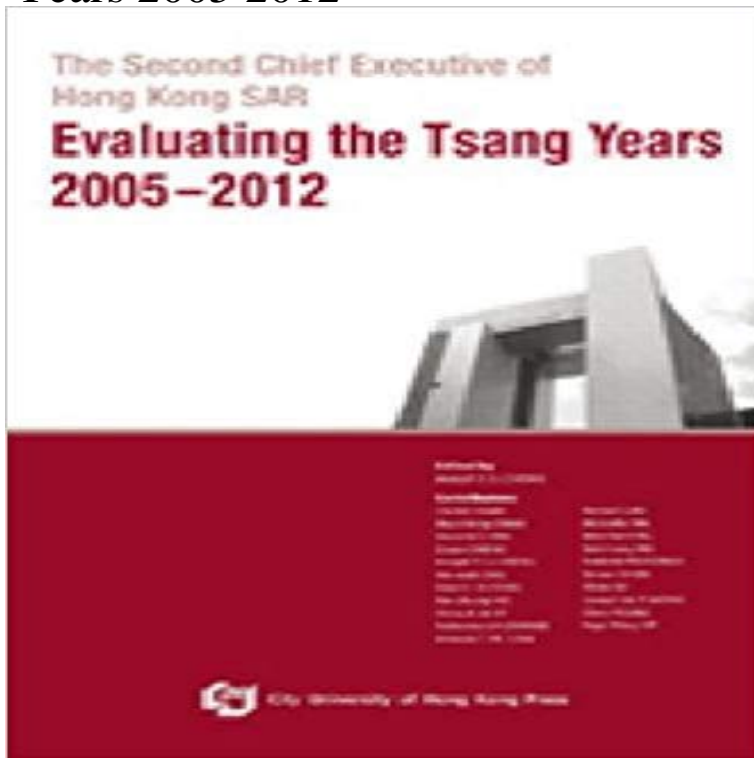


The Second Chief Executive of Hong Kong SAR - Evaluating the Tsang Years 2005 2012
