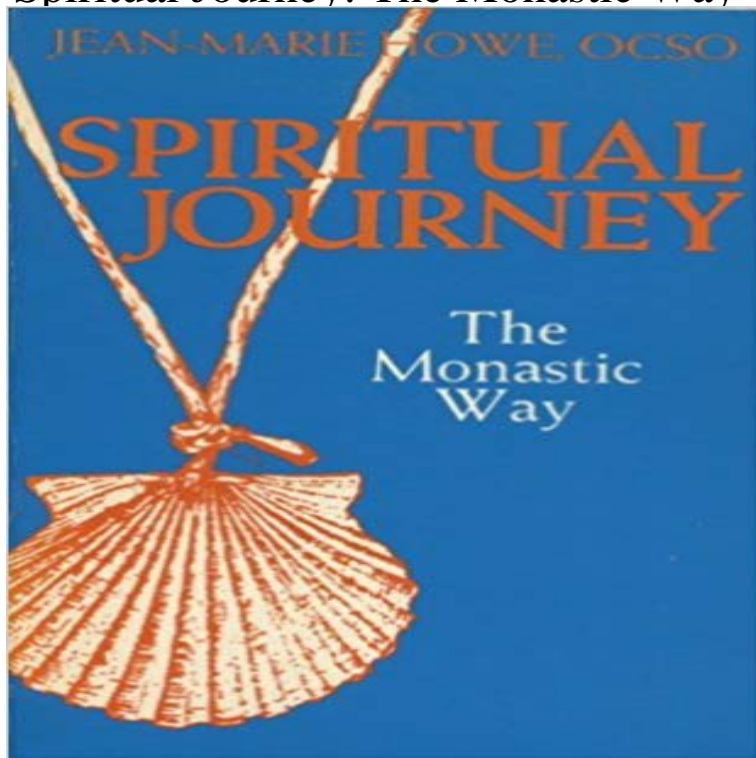


Spiritual Journey: The Monastic Way
