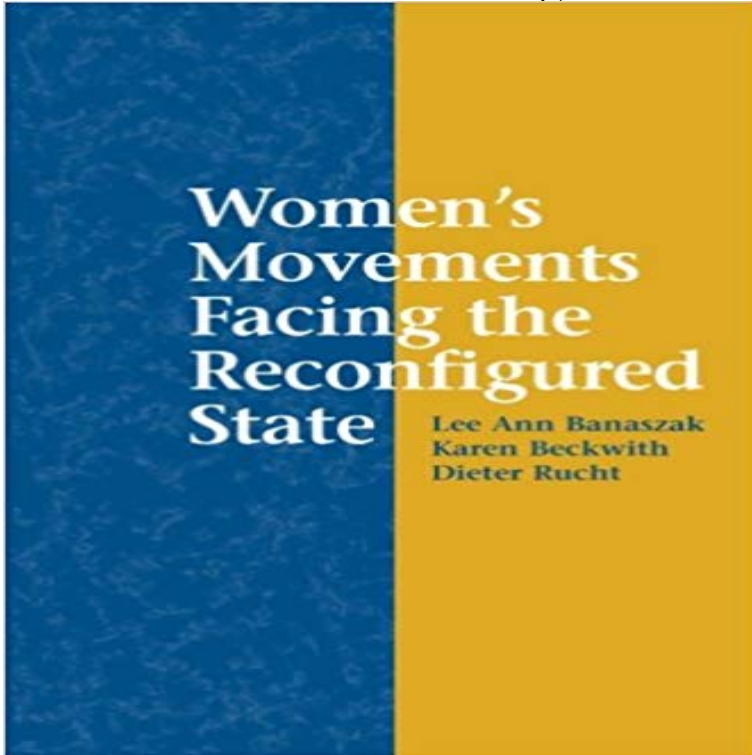


Womens Movements Facing the Reconfigured State
