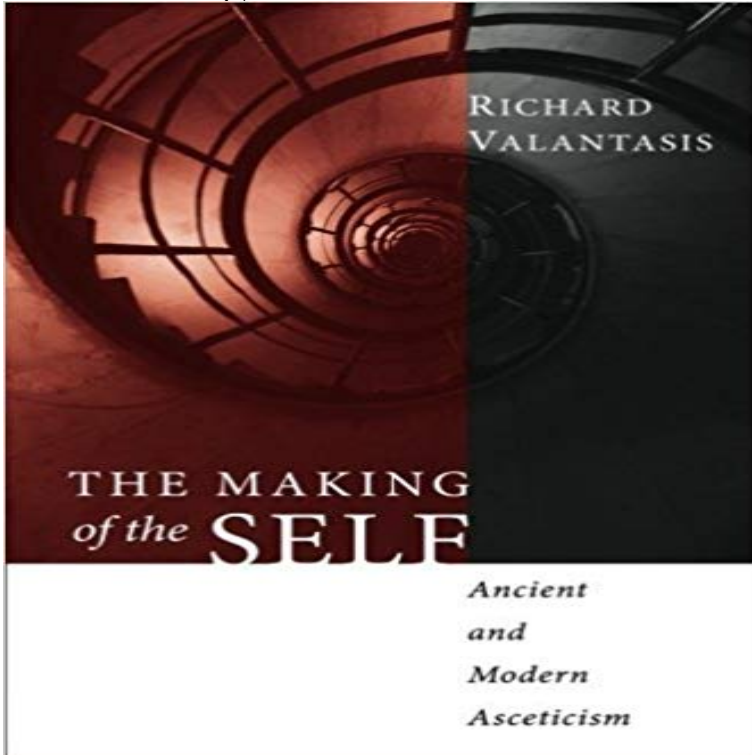


The Making of the Self: Ancient and Modern Asceticism
