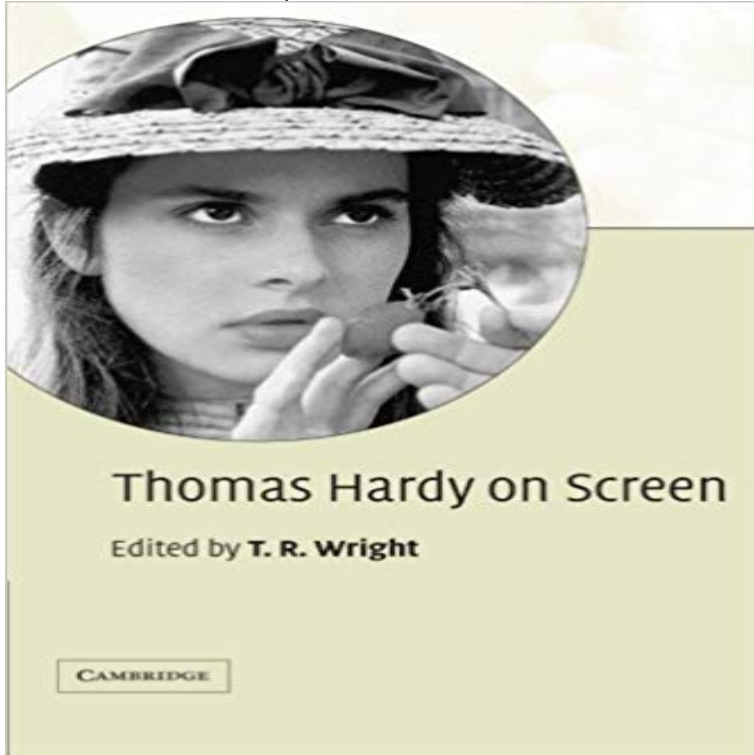


# Thomas Hardy on Screen
