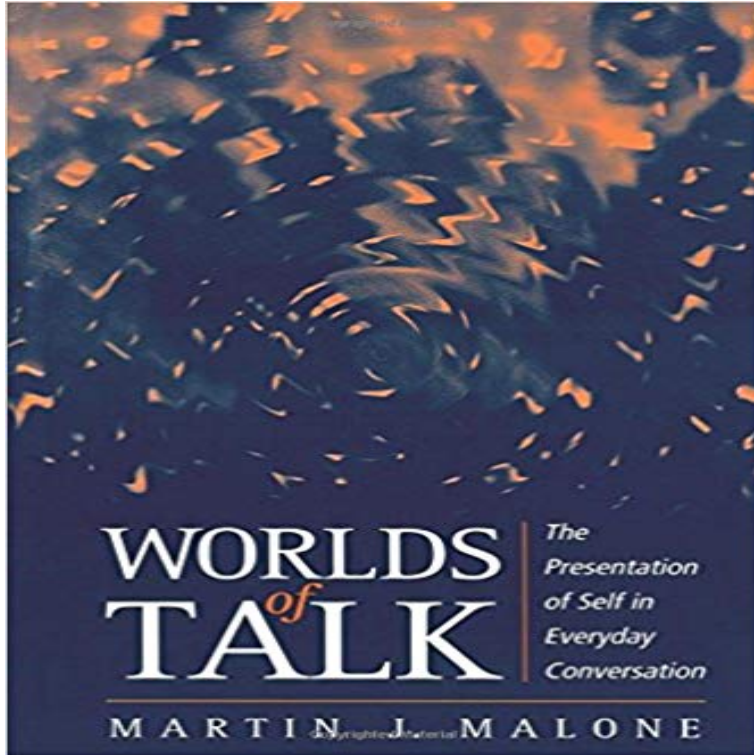


Worlds of Talk: The Presentation of Self in Everyday Conversation
